Jonathan said filings were up for 2018, mostly because of cases linked to drugs.

Becky Butler asked if the federal government's shutdown will affect Family Support. Sara Wibowo said there is no effect now but that a multi-state email addressing it is expected within a week or so.

Cullen Gatten discussed Fire District 17. He noted that Mike Leach was not a resident and was not registered to vote. He recommended the BOCC appoint one commissioner to Fire District 17.
