Jonathan Meyer said the county is hiring a felony DPA and an office assistant. He discussed potential funding for his victim witness employee. Jonathan asked that the Family Support attorney receive the pay increase the civil attorneys received. He said the position will be eliminated effective Jan. 1, 2019, as the county consolidates the position with Thurston County. Jonathan said the PA's Office already has the money.

Commissioner Stamper made a motion to place all civil attorneys on the same pay scale.
