**Special Services Bureau Highlights:**

- Detectives assisted patrol with a number of death investigations during the month. These investigations included a deceased subject found inside a burning home in Packwood, a male subject found hanging in the basement of a home in Winlock, a male subject in the Toledo area who died from a gunshot wound, and a skier whose body was recovered from a small avalanche after skiing out of bounds at White Pass Ski area.
- Detectives served a search warrant at a residence in the Toledo area for possession of child pornography. As a result, a 27-year-old male was arrested and booked into the Lewis County Jail after evidence was located.
- Detectives began an embezzlement case involving a local business where \$70,000-\$80,000 was reported stolen by an employee. As a result of the investigation, it was discovered the money was not actually stolen, but it was a bookkeeping error on the business' part.
- The Lewis County Support Volunteers participated in the Walk-N-Knock Food Drive in the Lewis County area.
- The Records Division processed a record number of CPLs and Pistol Transfers during 2016.

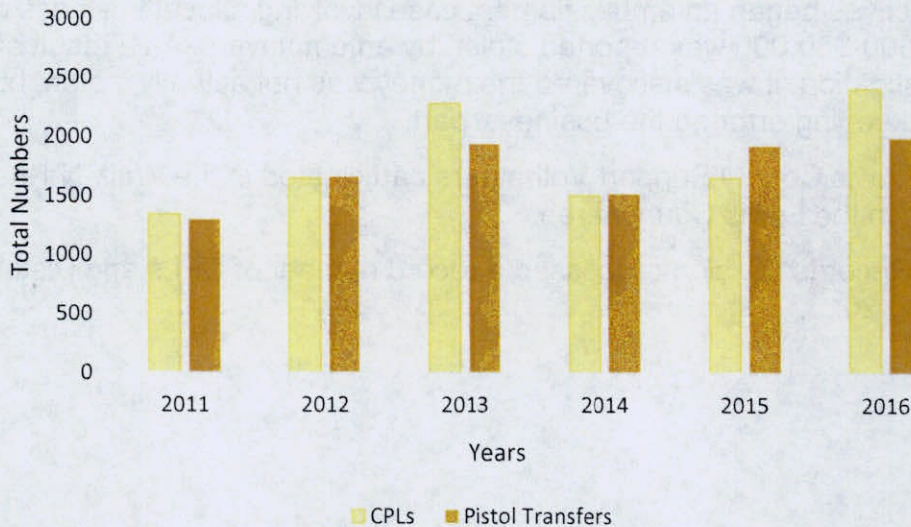

### Field Operations Bureau Highlights:

**Patrol:** December 16 was the 15<sup>th</sup> Annual Shop with a Cop Program, where LCSO personnel had a wonderful time giving back to the youth of our community and providing them with positive law enforcement interaction.

Of special note, discuss year-to-date Patrol statistics, and the mental health referrals (140) since April.

**JNET:** Detectives served 10 search warrants in the month, where four (4) firearms, a ½ lb. of meth, two (2) lbs. of marijuana, and 970 marijuana plants were seized. JNET, through their many partnerships, had a phenomenal year addressing and impacting illegal drug issues within Lewis County.

**Staffing:** Two (2) lateral deputies were hired during the month, Deputy Andrew Scrivner, previously from Toledo Police Department, and Deputy Chris Taylor, previously from Chehalis Police Department. Both reported for duty this past week. We are eagerly awaiting the graduation of Deputy Scott Robb from the Academy, which is scheduled for January 25. In addition, Deputies Emmet Woods and Julie Jacobo are progressing well at the Academy, but aren't scheduled to graduate until late March. At this time, we have one (1) remaining vacancy to fill on Patrol.
