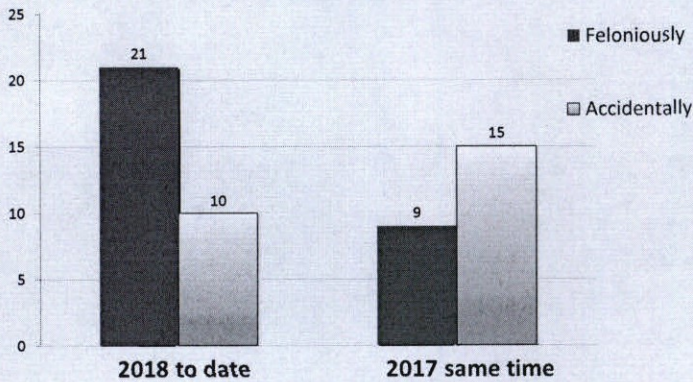

# 2018 LAW ENFORCEMENT OFFICERS KILLED

This is a graphic presentation of data regarding line-of-duty deaths, both felonious and accidental, collected from law enforcement agencies across the United States and U.S. territories by the FBI's Law Enforcement Officers Killed and Assaulted Program. This preliminary information is provided for officer safety studies, training, and other initiatives. The data are also published annually in the *Law Enforcement Officers Killed and Assaulted* publication.

## Officers Accidentally Killed: Type of Accident/ Call for Service or Reason for Involvement

- 8 Motor vehicle crash (car/truck/SUV)
  - 3 Patrol
  - 1 Assisting another law enforcement officer
  - 1 Investigative/enforcement
  - 1 Pursuit
  - 1 Training
  - 1 Other (en route to training)
- 1 Pedestrian officer struck by vehicle (assisting citizen)
- 1 Drowning (patrol)

## Officers Feloniously Killed: Weapons Used by Offenders

20 Officers were killed with firearms

- 9 Handguns
- 2 Rifles
- 1 Shotgun
- 8 Not reported



1 Officer was killed with a vehicle



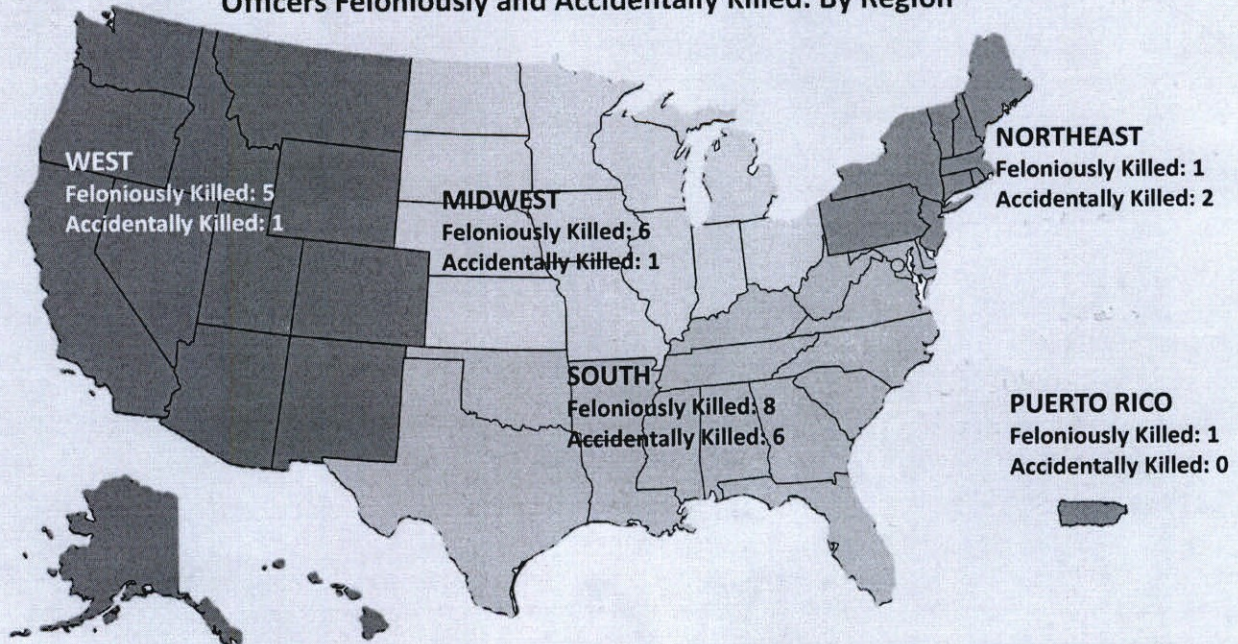
## Officers Feloniously Killed: Circumstance Encountered Upon Arrival at Scene of Incident

- 10 Investigative/enforcement
  - 7 Tactical situation
  - 1 Drug-related matter
  - 1 Investigative activity
  - 1 Investigate suspicious person/circumstance
- 5 Ambush (entrapment/premeditation)
- 3 Pursuit
  - 2 Foot
  - 1 Vehicular
- 1 Assist another law enforcement officer – Foot pursuit
- 1 Disorder/disturbance – Domestic violence
- 1 Respond to crime in progress – Assault

## Officers Feloniously Killed: Location of Firearm Wounds

- 5 Front head
- 2 Neck/throat
- 2 Front upper torso/chest
- 1 Rear head
- 1 Side head
- 9 Not reported
