4. Abstract: This report describes the synthesis and properties of a series of substituted benzene derivatives. The starting materials were benzene and various substituted benzenes. **Special Services Bureau Highlights:**

- Detectives are still waiting on audit results from the State Auditor's Office for a theft case related to the Mineral Fire Department. It is anticipated the results will be provided by mid-February.
- Detectives located a stolen firearm in Bozeman, Montana, taken during a burglary in Mineral in 1977. The victim's family was appreciative of the recovery.
- Detectives were involved in a search and rescue (SAR) mission looking for a missing angler on the Cowlitz River, which began on January 30, and is still ongoing as of now.
- As part of the Region 3 Critical Incident Investigation Team, detectives attended a three-day course on Understanding Human Performance in Critical Incidents sponsored by the Force Science Group.
- As a result of an investigation conducted by detectives, a former Lewis County Department of Health employee pled guilty to eight (8) counts of Theft in the First Degree; to include two (2) aggravators. She was subsequently sentenced on February 8.
- Leadership training by David Rabiner, hosted by the LCSO, was a great success with over 150 attendees.

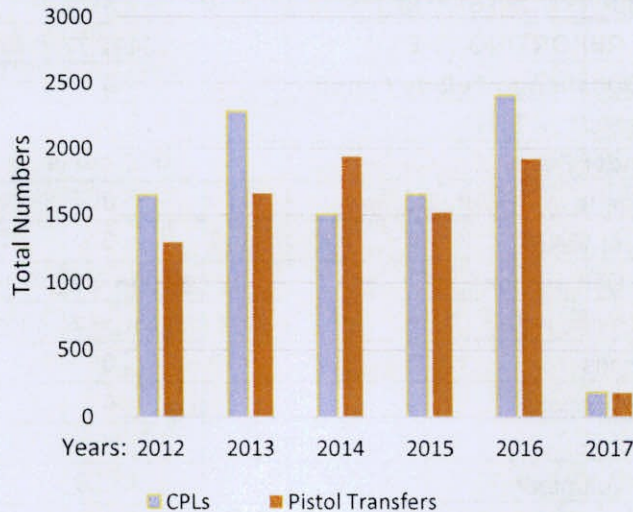

### Field Operations Bureau Highlights:

**Patrol:** Among daily calls for service for the month, deputies responded to two (2) rape investigations, two (2) vehicle thefts, 12 burglaries, and 20 thefts, and arrested six (6) individuals for DUI.

In partnership with the Lewis County Prosecutor's Office, we started a Cold Case Unit. Two (2) experienced retired detectives, Pat Beall and Tracy Wiese, will be working with our Detective Division and the Prosecutor's Office in these cold case investigations. The first case they will focus their efforts is the Roberta Dee Strasbaugh homicide from 1985.

On January 28, deputies, along with Search and Rescue personnel, responded to a missing fisherman in the area of the Blue Creek Boat Launch. Prathana Nammavong, a 43-year-old male from Des Moines, had contacted friends via cellphone on the previous Friday morning regarding fishing. The following day, his abandoned vehicle was located in the parking lot at the boat launch by those friends who came to fish with him that morning. Shortly thereafter, the friends located a chair and fishing poles on the river bank, presumably belonging to Mr. Nammavong, approximately a quarter of a mile down the Cowlitz River, near the confluence of Blue Creek with the Cowlitz River, but Mr. Nammavong was nowhere to be found and has not been heard from since. The investigation into his disappearance continues.

**Staffing:** We currently have three (3) deputies in their Field Training Officer Program (FTO); Deputy Andrew Scrivner, Deputy Chris Taylor, and Deputy Scott Robb. In addition, Deputies Emmet Woods and Julie Jacobo are progressing well at the Academy. We are looking forward to getting them on their FTO after their graduation in March. At this time, we have one (1) remaining vacancy to fill on Patrol.
