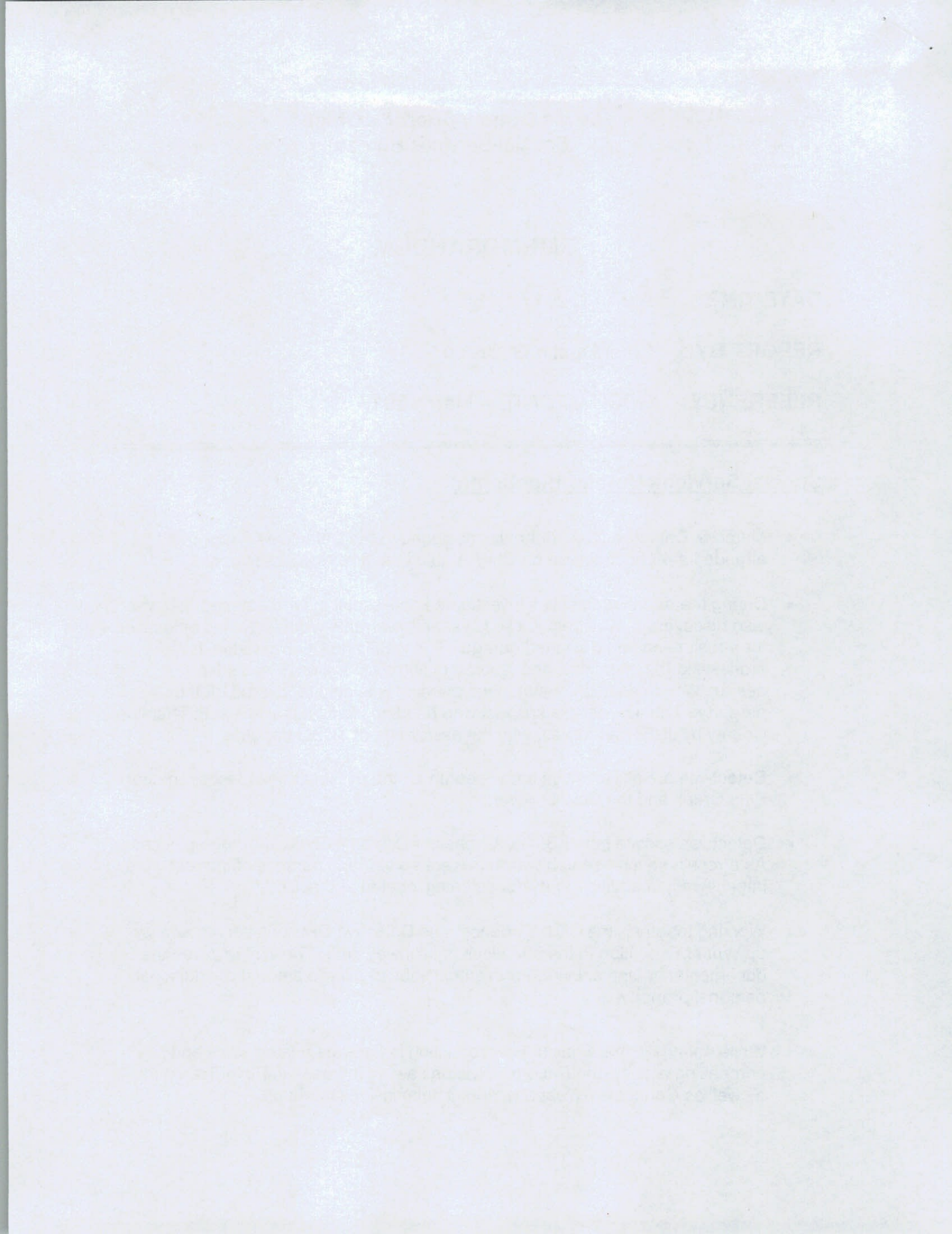

Special Services Bureau Highlights:

- March 6, Detective Mike Mohr was assigned to the Detective Division, and he attended a 40-hour course on Child Abuse Interview and Assessment.
- During the month, detectives investigated an Assault 1, where a meth lab was also discovered. As a result, two (2) search warrants were executed at location for a residence and detached garage. The WSP and DOE assisted in processing the chemicals and laboratory items for evidence and later destruction. In addition, a stolen travel trailer was also recovered off the property. The 47-year-old suspect who had fled, was later arrested in Thurston County by JNET detectives, with the assistance of TCSO deputies.
- Detectives are still involved in the search for the missing angler last seen near Blue Creek and the Cowlitz River.
- Detectives assisted the FBI and Chehalis PD in an extortion/pornography case. As a result, several search warrants were served and persons of interest were interviewed, in addition to evidence being located and seized.
- Working together, the Civil, Evidence, and Detective Divisions served a follow up Writ of Execution in the 600 block of Highway 603. The Writ involved the documentation and seizure, for eventual sale, of a large amount of additional personal property.
- While nationally there has been a reduction in firearms related sales and purchasing activity, the Records Division saw an increase in Pistol Transfers, as well as Concealed Weapons Permit submissions in March.

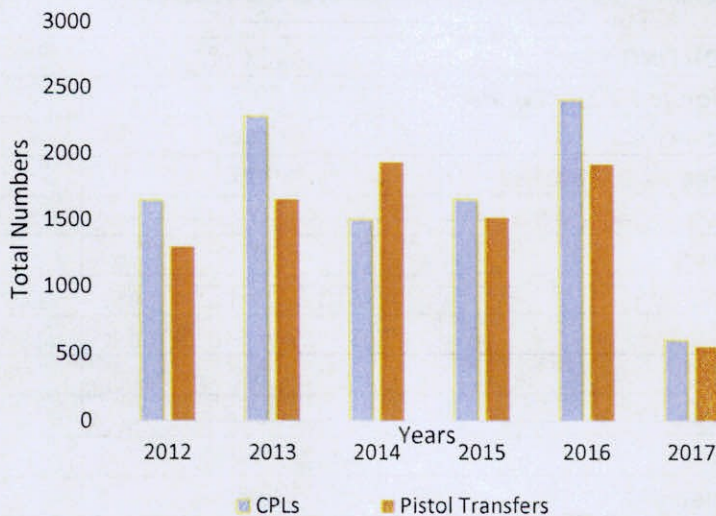

Field Operations Bureau Highlights:

Patrol: For the month, among daily calls for service, deputies responded to two (2) sexual assaults, three (3) vehicle thefts, 13 burglaries, 18 thefts, and arrested seven (7) for DUI.

In the last week of March, deputies responded to the 100 block of Joppish Road for an assault. Much to their surprise, once on scene they located a functional meth lab, along with finished product. The lab consisted of an assortment of chemical glassware, tubes and hoses, chemicals, a condenser, and powders that tested positive for ephedrine and red phosphorous. The lab was processed by the WSP Lab Team, lab-related items not taken as evidence were disposed of by DOE, and Lewis County Health posted the property as such. Subsequently, two arrests associated with the criminal activity were made.

In partnership with the Thurston County Sheriff's Office, we conducted another search with two boats near the confluence of Blue Creek and the Cowlitz River for the missing Des Moines angler. Unfortunately, the results of the search were negative.

Staffing: Selected as an internal agency transfer, we anticipate Deputy Jared Kasinger heading off to the Basic Academy soon. Deputies Emmet Woods, Julie Jacobo, and Scott Robb are progressing well in their field training. At this time, we have one (1) remaining vacancy to fill on Patrol.
